Answer:

WA Police has been allocated the funds to purchase the additional nine (9) dogs.

At the present time there are thirteen (13) operational General Purpose (GP) dogs plus six (6) in training which will provide a total of nineteen (19) GP operational dogs.

Out of the extra allocation of nine (9) dogs, three (3) have been procured and are being trained with the remaining six (6) to be procured in early 2014. Once all dogs are procured there will be a total of twenty five (25) GP dogs.

Question: Mrs M.H. Roberts asked: I just want to know whether the first nine dogs are all still operational.

Answer: Of the original nine (9) GP dogs there are seven (7) remaining. One has been retired and one is deceased (put down).

Question: Mr R.F. Johnson asked: Can the minister give me the number of hours each of those 49 concept vehicles spend on the road?

Answer: There are currently 48 Advanced Traffic Management Vehicles or concept vehicles operational within Western Australia Police. The total number of hours concept vehicles spend on the road is not able to be calculated. The data extracted from the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system provides an accurate report of the hours the officers assigned to the 48 concept vehicles have 'booked on for being on duty' but does not distinguish between time spent patrolling on the road and responding to other tasking or incidents.

The total number of hours on duty for all concept vehicles is 40,313.33 hours with an average of 839.86 hours per vehicle.
