GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES, CLEANING SERVICES

1177. Hon. C.L. Edwardes to the Minister for Consumer and Employment Protection

I refer the Minister to recent statements that the State Labor Government was moving toward 'in house cleaning services' and ask:

- (a) which Departments and Agencies under the Minister's portfolio use out-sourced cleaning services;
- (b) has a decision been made to bring these services 'in house';
- (c) has a cost benefit analysis been carried out on bringing the cleaning services 'in house';
- (d) if not, why not;
- (e) will 'in house' cleaning services be required to be cost competitive with out-sourced cleaning services;
- (f) will current contract employees be given first choice to fill any new positions created;
- (g) if not, why not;
- (h) if no to (e), what is the estimated increased cost to each Department or Agency budget; and
- (i) will Departments and Agencies be compensated for the increased cost incurred for complying with Labor Policy?
