3724. Ms J. Farrer to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Mental Health:

I refer to the Minister's answer to my Question on Notice No. 3172, specifically concerning the Ord Valley Aboriginal Health Service and ask:

- (a) in 2013–2014, how many:
 - (i) Back to Country Camps were held and how many people attended each of these camps;
 - (ii) Youth AMHFA Training were delivered and how many people participated and of these people, how many completed the program successfully;
 - (iii) Healing, Empowerment and Leadership Programs were delivered and how many people participated and of those people, how many successfully completed the program; and
 - (iv) AMHFA Train the Trainer Programs were delivered and how many people participated in these programs and of these people, how many successfully completed the program; and
- (b) in 2013–2014, what is the number of people that have accessed services provided by Ord Valley Aboriginal Health Service as a result of the additional funding of \$232 880?

Ms A.R. Mitchell replied:

- (a) (i) Three camps were organised but due to timing issues and deaths in the community they were postponed. Negotiations are underway in relation to rescheduling these camps.
 - (ii) 12 participated and completed.
 - (iii) 3 participated and completed.
 - (iv) 12 participated and completed.
- (b) This cannot be accurately reported as clients access the service for a variety of issues and/or health concerns.
