## MINISTRY OF JUSTICE, OPERATIONAL STANDARDS DIRECTORATE

518. Mr RIEBELING to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Justice:

I refer to the answer to question on notice No. 2328 of 2000 and ask -
(a) who headed up the Operational Standards Directorate which was formed in March 1997;
(b) what -
(i) (level/classification) was that person/officer;
(ii) position is that officer/person currently undertaking;
(iii) skills and qualifications does the officer/person have to have to meet the criteria to fill the position; and
(iv) level/classification is the officer/person currently in the position ;
(c) what amount was spent on this Directorate in the 1997/98 and 1998/99 financial years;
(d) was the amount spent by the Directorate of the order of $\$ 680,000$;
(e) if not, what is the correct amount;
(f) was the Directorate required to deliver appropriate outcomes as determined by the Director General;
(g) were those outcomes achieved at the commencement of the 1999/2000 financial year;
(h) if not, why not; and
(i) have those outcomes now been achieved?

Mr BARRON-SULLIVAN replied:
(a) Mr Peter Moore, at the time Director, Prisons, was seconded to head the Operational Standards Directorate with effect from 7th March, 1997.
(b) (i) Director (Class 1), Senior Executive Service;
(ii) Monitor, Acacia Prison;
(iii) As the holder of a Senior Executive Service position, the officer met the skills required by the following Public Sector criteria:-

- Lead in the work environment
- Facilitate workforce effectiveness
- Resource the work environment
- Seek and accept opportunities
- Promote effective Public Policy
- Build and maintain relationships
- Engage in self-development
- Exercise an appropriate work perspective
- Achieve customer focus
- Experience in broad based Prison Management
