- (b) Yes. Participants are required to submit their research reports to each of the sponsoring bodies (Department of the Premier and Cabinet, Curtin University and the Institute of Public Administration Australia). In addition, participants are required to deliver a seminar outlining their research findings to each of the sponsor bodies.
- (c) Not applicable.
- (d) The cost to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet is 30% of the fellows' salaries for the fellowship period, to a maximum of \$5000 each. The remaining costs are funded by Curtin (40%), IPAA (15%) and the fellow's agency (15%). There have been two exceptions to this: Ms Paton's and Mr Hale's fellowships were entirely funded by their own agency.
