## 97. Ms M.J. DAVIES to the Minister for Water:

I have a supplementary question. Given that the minister has confirmed he is dragging his heels to commit to this transformational project why is the minister unwilling to commit and does he know or does he not care that his noncommittal is jeopardising federal funding?

## Mr D.J. KELLY replied:
