## BUNBURY AUTOMOTIVE TRAINING FACILITY, MINISTER'S VISIT, MORNING TEA

261. Hon. C.L. Edwardes to the Minister for Consumer and Employment Protection

I refer the Minister to his recent visit to the Bunbury Automotive Training facility and ask -

- (a) who supplied the morning tea for the opening;
- (b) who paid for the morning tea and what was the cost;
- (c) is the Minister aware that there is an outstanding Hospitality and Catering Training facility, with highly motivated and well-trained apprentices in Bunbury, at the same site as the Automotive Training facility; and
- (d) does the Minister believe that the money would have been better spent on having the Hospitality Training apprentices at Bunbury prepare and serve the morning tea?

## Mr J.C. KOBELKE replied:

- (a) Leonie's Catering Service.
- (b) South West Regional College of TAFE \$865.70
- (c) There is a Hospitality Training facility at Robertson Drive, College Grove, where outstanding apprentice training occurs. The Automotive Training facility is not, however, located on the same site but is in Sylvan Way, Picton.
- (d) The Sylvan Way Annexe does not have kitchen facilities, which precluded apprentices from preparing food on site or storing and serving it at the appropriate temperatures, in accordance with HACCP<sup>(1)</sup> and Food Safe requirements compliant with the State Health Act 1911. The College does not have refrigerated trucks or mobile warmers to transfer food prepared at the Bunbury Campus to other sites.
