67. Hon C L Edwardes to the Minister for Labour Relations
- (1) I refer the Minister to the new Building Industry and Special Projects Inspectorate and ask from where do they operate?
- (2) What is the line of authority?
- (3) What positions have been created and at what classifications levels and upon what basis were the classifications defined?
- (4) When were these positions advertised?
- (5) How many applications were received?
- (6) What are the names of the selection panel and who is the Chair?
- (7) How many applicants were shortlisted?
- (8) Did the Minister or any of his staff in his Ministerial office discuss with the Assistant Chief Executive Officer or any other DOPLAR officer or any member of the Panel the candidates for these positions?
- (9) Did the Assistant Chief Executive Officer or any other DOPLAR officer or any member of the Panel discuss with the Minister or any of his staff the candidates for the position?
- (10) What experience in the Building and Construction Industry do the appointed Public Servants have?
- (11) What training have these Public Servants undertaken in respect to the Building and Construction Industry?
- (12) Will the Minister table a copy of each of these members job description?

Mr KOBELKE replied:

- (1) Within the Fair Workplaces Division of the Department of Productivity and Labour Relations.
- (2) The Assistant Director of the Building Industry and Special Projects Inspectorate reports to the Executive Director of Fair Workplaces, who reports to the Chief Executive Officer of DOPLAR.
- (3) An Assistant Director L8, a Senior Investigations Officer L6, and an Industrial Inspector L3/4. The levels were determined in accordance with public sector assessment and determination of classification procedures.
- (4) An advertisement for the Senior Investigation Officer L6 was placed in The Intersector on May 16 2001 and the West Australian on 19 May 2001.
