These amounts include works for Parliament House and all its associated premises nearby. Items in the recurrent column are to do with maintenance and faults. Items in the capital column are mainly building additions such as the Legislative Assembly committee rooms fitout at 11 Harvest Terrace, the northern extension and the library relocation, but that column also includes such things as lift control replacement, ceiling membrane replacements and floor covering replacement.
