Mr M. McGOWAN: Yes, the member for Dawesville. I will quote Rick Newnham —

... this Budget goes a long way to rebuilding confidence in the business community around stable, you know, investment climate, creating new jobs ... So this is a really important Budget for stimulating the economy and ... creating jobs.

That was Rick Newnham. Do I have to say it again? That was Rick Newnham. The Civil Contractors Federation—do the opposition know it—said —

Mr D.C. Nalder: That is a shocking quote. That was ordinary.

Mr M. McGOWAN: Now he is getting at Kitty Prodonovich! We cannot keep this guy happy.

Under this government business confidence is back, 30 000 jobs have been created, we have the highest participation rate in the country, we are building at least 50 per cent of railcars here in Western Australia and we secured federal money—we actually go and ask! I sit down with the Prime Minister and federal ministers and my ministers and say, "Let's work together to achieve outcomes." Slightly different from what occurred before. What do we have? Byford, Morley–Ellenbrook, Yanchep, Thornlie–Cockburn. Byford was the one the former government opposed. There will be unprecedented investment in new roads, an affordable housing package, tourism and destination marketing, a \$24 million investment in grains research and development, the new regional economic development scheme, and billions of dollars on regional roads. It is all happening out there in regional Western Australia—good economic management combined with good financial management.
