## DEPARTMENT OF RACING, GAMING AND LIQUOR, EMPLOYMENT OF ACTS AT LICENSED PREMISES

## 1103. Hon BARRY HOUSE to the Minister for Racing and Gaming:

- (1) Will the minister confirm that the Department of Racing, Gaming and Liquor has recently implemented a new policy guideline making the hiring of interstate or international acts a key condition of extended trading hours on public holidays?
- (2) On what basis has this policy been implemented?
- (3) Does the minister support a policy that effectively discriminates against local bands and performers?
- (4) If not, will the minister direct his department to ensure that Western Australian talent has the same right to perform at licensed premises as imported bands and disc jockeys?

## Hon N.D. GRIFFITHS replied:

(1)-(4) A policy exists that deals with extended trading hours. That policy refers to non-Western Australian performers. I have recently examined its wording to ensure that it is absolutely clear that this issue will in no way damage the interests of Western Australian performers.
