## CLIMATE CHANGE

## Notice of Motion

Hon Louise Pratt gave notice that at the next sitting of the House she will move -
That this house calls on the federal government to provide the communities of Western Australia with the appropriate resources to deal with the likelihood of real and significant climate change, including -
the allocation of increased levels of research funding to address likely changes to Western Australia's climatic systems;
ratification of the Kyoto Protocol by the commonwealth which considers and addresses Western Australia's position as a resource-driven economy; and
programs of public education which address the likely need for future public adaptation and responses to climate change.

## Point of Order

Hon NORMAN MOORE: I understand that this part of the session is for the giving of notices of motion for leave to introduce bills. The Leader of the House has done that and another member has given notices of motion. Mr President, what is the situation?

The PRESIDENT: The situation is that I asked whether there are any notices of motion. In fact, I have a different order from the second order that was published. We then proceeded. I found that, as well as notices of motion for leave to introduce bills, we also have notices of motion. Therefore, I have been working on the assumption that we are recording with two specific sets; we are taking notices of motion for leave to introduce bills, and I gave the call to Hon Peter Foss and the Leader of the House, and also notices of motion. I do make the point, however, that a member cannot move in series a set of motions and that if other members have notices of motions, we will re-order them accordingly so that one member does not have a set of motions that takes precedence.
Hon NORMAN MOORE: Thank you, Mr President. I presume I can now move my notice of motion.
The PRESIDENT: Yes.
