- (1) What funding did the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Western Australia receive from all agencies under the Minister's portfolios in the 2000/2001 financial year?
- (2) What was the amount and purpose of each payment?

Mr R.C. KUCERA replied:

Department of Health

1. In the 2000/2001 financial year the Department of Health paid the Chamber of Commerce and Industry \$70 817.86.
2. Details of these payments are:

Royal Perth Hospital made a payment of \$382.50 for consultancy work associated with the Review of documentation and preparation of advice on the 'foul linen allowance'.

The Metropolitan Health Service made a payment of \$65 000 being the membership fee for the period June 2000 to May 2001.

Graylands Hospital paid \$49.50 for an Occupational Safety & Health session for their hospital staff.

Swan Health Service paid \$20.00 for an officer to attend a Nursing shortage forum.

Armadale Health Service paid \$1 948.20 for an employee relations consultancy conducted in March & April 2001, and another \$1 848.00 for a consultancy on employee relations conducted in February 2001.

Dental Health Services paid \$66.00 for a subscription to a periodical magazine.

Osborne Park Health Service paid \$346.50 for an annual subscription for publication of 'HR Link Service'.

Boyup Brook Hospital paid \$1 157.16 for an annual subscription.
