12. Mr C.D. HATTON to the Minister for Sport and Recreation:

The recent success of the Socceroos has excited soccer fans throughout Australia and now the Socceroos are coming to Perth for the first time since 2005. Can the minister please update the house on the exciting development for soccer fans in Western Australia?

One of the reasons we were able to achieve this outcome is that we have such fantastic facilities here in Western Australia. This government put \$95.14 million —

Ms M.J. DAVIES: The game is going to be played at nib Stadium—a stadium into which this state government put \$94 million for its redevelopment.
