WHALE WATCHING, AUGUSTA AND DUNSBOROUGH, FACILITIES FOR THE DISABLED

- 308. Hon Barry House to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Disability Services
- (1) Is the Minister aware of international criticism of the lack of facilities to allow disabled people to join the popular whale watching tours from Augusta and Dunsborough?
- (2) Does the Minister support the need for facilities for the disabled to embark and disembark on these tours in Augusta and Dunsborough?
- (3) If so, will the Minister work with the Premier and other Cabinet Ministers to provide these facilities?
- Hon LJILJANNA RAVLICH replied:
- 1. Yes. I am aware of an international tourist who wrote a letter of concern about the lack of access to the proprietors of the tours.
- 2. Yes.
- 3. Yes. The responsibility for provision of major public infrastructure lies with the Department for Planning and Infrastructure and I will be supportive of any viable strategy that provides for the needs of people who have disabilities and are ageing.
