## PEEL COMMUNITY PALLIATIVE CARE PROGRAM

## 1238. Hon SALLY TALBOT to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Health:

I refer to the highly successful Peel Community Palliative Care program that has been operating for 14 years in Peel.

- (1) Is this program proposed to be closed or defunded by the Department of Health?
- (2) If yes to (1), why has this decision been made?
- (3) If yes to (1), what service provider will provide palliative care within the community in the Peel region to replace Peel Community Palliative Care?
- (4) If there are new arrangements proposed for the provision of palliative care in the Peel region, who has been consulted about these changes and what are the reasons for the changes?

## Hon ALYSSA HAYDEN replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question.

- (1) No; the service will not be closed or defunded. There is a proposal to contract this service to a private provider. Services will continue to be funded by the Department of Health. The service will continue to be based in the Peel region.
- (2) No decision has been made. A service will continue to be based in the Peel region. Key priorities of the service will be access to 24-hour medical advice, after-hours access to the clinical nurse consultant, provision of respite care at home, access to allied health professionals, a paid chaplaincy service, support of electronic technology to document care and enhanced engagement with local general practitioners in the Peel local area.
- (3) The service provider is to be determined.
- (4) Models of care have been discussed with staff and the involved general practitioner, Dr Peter Wallace. An appropriate communication plan will be implemented when indicated.
