3. The Pilbara & Gascoyne region planned increases for visiting specialist services are:

Paediatrics to Cotton Creek, Punmu, Marble Bar, Nullagine, Warralong, Yandeyarra and Jigalong. General Medicine to Cotton Creek, Punmu, Marble Bar, Nullagine, Jigalong, Karratha/Roebourne Psychiatry – Jigalong, Newman/Tom Price, Nullagine, Marble Bar, Yandeyarra.

The Kimberley region planned increases for visiting specialist services are:

Paediatrics – to Kutjunka region, Fitzroy area, Gibb River Community, Bidyadanga. General Surgery – Fitzroy, Halls Creek, Wyndham.

- 4. To increase services for the communities and to deliver the services locally, from the resident specialists' services in the northwest, rather than from Perth. The Pilbara Gascoyne Health Region is also increasing specialist services from Perth in areas such as ENT, orthopaedics, ophthalmology.
- 5. The additional funds through the Medical Specialist Outreach Program are assisting health services to put more resources into increased visiting specialist programs.
- 6. Savings generally come by way of cost offsets through reduced patient travel costs. It is not possible to quantify the exact savings but they do help to offset overall costs.
- 7. There may be some savings generated by increasing local access to medical specialist services. Any savings go towards offsetting the cost of providing services.
