Question: Mr Hyde asked will the formation of the Economic Regulator generate savings? What are they?

Answer: It is not possible, at this time, to estimate the savings that will result from formation of the Economic Regulator. The form of the new regulator is yet to be determined by Government.

Question: Mr Hyde asked in relation to review of performance standards: Will the community be involved? If so, how will they be involved?

Answer: The period for public submissions has been extended to Friday 12 October 2001. 50 written submissions have already been received. After 28 September 2001 the submissions will be placed on the Office of Water Regulation's website so they can be viewed by licence holders and customers. The submissions made by the Water Corporation, Water Boards and some shires are already on the website.

The next stage of the review will be the assessment of the submissions by the Office of Water Regulation and preparation of draft recommendations. These will be taken to a workshop to be held in November that will bring together customers, licence holders and other stakeholders.

Following the workshop the Office of Water Regulation will finalise the recommendations before forwarding them to the Minister for her consideration. With the Minister's approval the recommendations will be implemented by amending the licences, probably in mid-2002.
