## RETAIL TRAINEE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Statement

HON MATT BENSON-LIDHOLM (South West) [9.57 pm]: I would like to make a brief statement about this year's Retail Trainee of the Year Awards, which were held on 17 October. It was my pleasure to represent the government and present a series of very well deserved awards on that night. Every year the Wholesale, Retail and Personal Services Industry Training Council of Western Australia hosts the Retail Trainee of the Year Awards for the retail industry. The purpose of those awards is to recognise excellence in training - that is, in traineeships - with the long-term goal of encouraging retailing as a career. The awards are in their thirteenth year and cover the retail, pharmacy and floristry industries.
