The SPEAKER: Member for Girrawheen, I call you to order for the second time. Carry on, minister.

Mr J.M. FRANCIS: What they have at the moment is one station that houses the career guys and the volunteer guys. It is past its use-by date. The member for Bassendean will get the best and most modern fire station in Western Australia, just down the road, to service his electorate, backed up, when needed, by another career brigade. If the member for Bassendean wants to stand here and say he does not think that is the right way to go, that is fine; that is his choice. But I think the people of his electorate deserve to get the first-class service that they are paying for.
