

WAGES POLICY — POLICE

377. Hon TJORN SIBMA to the minister representing the Minister for Police:

I refer to the McGowan Labor government breaking its election promise to the WA Police Union to support a 1.5 per cent pay increase for police officers.

- (1) What is the anticipated total salaries and wages bill for WA Police per annum factoring in the government's wages policy of a \$1 000 rise a year?
- (2) What would be the anticipated total salaries and wages bill for WA Police per annum if the original 1.5 per cent pay increase was honoured?
- (3) Can the minister list each of the categories/classifications of police officers as a component of the total WAPOL salaries and wages bill?
- (4) For each category/classification of police officer, can the minister provide the following information—current WAPOL salaries and wages bill per annum; the anticipated WAPOL salaries and wages bill per annum on the basis of the \$1 000 per annum pay offer; and, the anticipated WAPOL salaries and wages bill per annum on the basis of the original 1.5 per cent pay increase as promised?
