

DISABILITY JUSTICE CENTRES — BASSENDEAN ELECTORATE

259. Mr D.J. KELLY to the Premier:

The Premier said in his answer that a conversation has to start somewhere. Is it not the case that for the last few months the school has been in discussions with the government about the future of that land and not once was it told that the government was considering using it for a disability justice centre?
