EMPLOYEE ENTITLEMENTS SUPPORT SCHEME

- 71. Mrs EDWARDES to the Minister for Labour Relations:
- (1) What is the Government position in respect to contributing to the federal Government's Employee Entitlements Support Scheme?
- (2) How many payments to employees have been made in Western Australia since the scheme began, which companies employed these employees, and how much has been received by these employees?
- (3) Are there other employees from companies presently under consideration, and if so how many and to what dollar amount?

Mr KOBELKE replied:

- (1) The Government has not agreed to participate in the federal Government's Employee Entitlements Support Scheme.
- (2) The federal Government reports that as at 31 March 2001, a total of \$319 924 has been paid in respect to 176 employees in Western Australia since the Employee Entitlements Support Scheme commenced operation on 1 January 2000. The Government does not have access to information regarding which companies employed these employees. However, some limited information is contained in the Employee Entitlements Support Scheme Year One Activity Report released by the federal Government in January 2001.
- (3) The Government is not privy to such details.
