CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT (RECOGNITION OF ABORIGINAL PEOPLE) BILL 2014

895. Ms J. FARRER to the Premier:

I have a supplementary question. Why would the Premier hold off on supporting this bill—he talked about the Noongar people, but this bill embraces all Aboriginal people in the state of Western Australia—when every other state in this country has already included Indigenous people in their Constitutions?

Mr C.J. BARNETT replied:

As I was about to indicate, the government will support, in a bipartisan way, correctly drafted and correctly canvassed legislation —

He was not telling the truth.
