## 174. Hon, C.L. Edwardes to the Minister for Consumer and Employment Protection

I refer the Minister to the draft Memorandum of Understanding between the Building Industry Special Projects Inspectorate and the Police Service and ask -

  - 29 August 2002 a minor amendment clarifying the role of Building Industry Special Projects Inspectorate in providing assistance to persons wanting immediate police assistance, and providing information to the police on criminal matters.

- (g) the memorandum of understanding was signed by the A/Director General of DOCEP and the WA Commissioner of Police on 30 August 2002. It is not a matter for me to agree to the changes. I am satisfied agreement has been reached between the two agencies in relation to criminal matters in the building industry.
