Through the Child Care Centre, Family Centre and Community Centre Programs, the Department has entered into a range of Peppercorn leases since 1985 to acquire land on which to construct these centres. While records of individual centres are kept they do not include details of the leased area. To ascertain the total leased area for these programs would involve an investigation of individual plans, involving considerable time and resources.
