## **BUSINESS-RELATED TAXES**

## 221. Mr T.R. BUSWELL to the Minister for Small Business:

Will the minister advise the house if he has discussed with either the Premier or the Treasurer the possibility of the state government abolishing or reducing any of the business-related taxes that are mentioned in the GST agreement, including mortgage stamp duty, stamp duty on the hire of goods and business conveyancing?

Several members interjected.

**The SPEAKER**: Order, members! It is very difficult for members to ask questions without interjections. I call the member for Girrawheen to order for the first time. I am sure that the minister does not need her assistance in answering.

## Mr J.B. D'ORAZIO replied:

The member is a day late with his question. He is not a very good agent for *The West Australian*. I will not disclose the private discussions I have had with anybody on this issue.
