# 683. Mr M.F. BOARD to the Minister for Health:

- (1) Is the minister aware that the emergency department redevelopments and upgrades at Swan District Hospital; the general ward upgrades at Royal Perth, King Edward Memorial, Fremantle and Princess Margaret Hospitals; construction of the Geraldton Hospital, the paediatric ward at Albany Regional Hospital and the new dental clinic at Joondalup Health Campus; and the expansion of surgery facilities at Princess Margaret Hospital announced by the Premier on Sunday were all announced in last year's budget?
- (2) Is the minister also aware that the emergency departments at Sir Charles Gairdner and Princess Margaret Hospitals and Rockingham-Kwinana Health Service were all announced in the minister's press releases during the year to be completed by now, yet most have not started?
- (3) Will the minister admit that his Government is recycling unspent capital works funding on projects that are at least one year old?
