Question: Mrs Edwardes sought an explanation for the increase in consultancy expenses, and a breakdown of the actual budget for 2001-02 and what is being proposed for 2002-03?

Answer: With respect to the first part of the question, the information contained in the "Statement of Financial Performance" relating to consultancy expense is the result of a reclassification of expenses during the preparation of the budget papers. The \$56,000 contained in the column for 2001-02 Estimated Actual should more accurately be classified as a combination of consultancy expense and supplies and services.

The Tribunal budget is not large and it is necessary to include provision for external consultancy and professional services in the event that specialist advice is required. Should the Tribunal require advice that is not available in-house, a separate provision is necessary as the remainder of the budget is non-discretionary.
