- (9) Students at Laverton Primary School have five options to access a secondary education program:
 - Remain at Laverton Primary School and participate in an integrated program in a multi-age classroom with a designated secondary teacher.
 - Enrol with the School of Isolated and Distance Education.
 - Attend secondary facilities outside of the town and access government boarding funding subsidies.
 - Structured Workplace Learning Programs.
 - School-Based Traineeships.
