

INTERSTATE OFFENDERS SERVING PAROLE IN WA

405. Mr M.J. Birney to the Minister for Justice

I refer to the 25 interstate offenders that are currently serving their parole in Western Australia, and ask -

- (a) will the Minister advise the exact nature of the crimes that were committed in each case;
- (b) will the Minister advise the length of jail sentence imposed and length of time served in each case;
- (c) will the Minister advise if any of these offenders have reoffended whilst in Western Australia; and
 - (i) if so, the nature of each offence; and
 - (ii) if any of these individuals have reoffended, will the Minister advise why they were not sent back to their State of origin;
- (d) will the Minister advise the number of Western Australian offenders that were paroled to the Eastern States for the years -
 - (i) 2001;
 - (ii) 2002;
 - (iii) 2003;
 - (iv) 2004; and
 - (v) 2005; and
- (e) will the Minister advise the number of interstate offenders that were paroled to Western Australia for the years -
 - (i) 2001;
 - (ii) 2002;
 - (iii) 2003;
 - (iv) 2004; and
 - (v) 2005?

Mr J.B. D'ORAZIO replied:

- (a) As Minister I will not jeopardise the operational requirements of the management of offenders by revealing personal or specific details of an individual offender.
