(1) As at 30 June 2014, WA Country Health Service (WACHS) Kimberley had 1,085 paid employees.

- (3) As at 30 June 2014, there were 100 paid employees of WACHS Kimberley who had either identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander or were employed against positions where Aboriginality is a requirement under section 50(d) of the Equal Opportunities act. Identification as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander is not a compulsory requirement of employment; as a result there is the possibility that numbers are under reported.
