340. Ms M.J. Davies to the Minister for Police:

I refer to the exemptions to the G2G Pass since inception, and I ask:

- (a) How many interventions have you made or requested regarding the G2G Pass system to assist:
 - (i) residents returning to Western Australia;
 - (ii) new residents relocating from interstate;
 - (iii) lobbyists or stakeholders in your portfolio;
 - (iv) related family;
 - (v) related family of Members of Parliament requested by Members of Parliament; and
 - (vi) other:
- (b) For those in (a), how many of those interventions were made after the Minister received a formal request; and
- (c) How many times have you declared a conflict of interest with any decision falling under your remit as a Minister of the Crown:
 - (i) Please detail the reason of the conflict of interest and the date it was declared?
