681. Hon NICK GOIRAN to the parliamentary secretary representing the Attorney General:

I refer to the Attorney General's media statement of 8 August 2022 titled "Court services in Collie to remain open".

- (1) What was the genesis for the review into the Collie courthouse?
- (2) When did it commence?
- (3) Did the Attorney General receive a briefing note or similar document at or around the commencement and conclusion of the review process?
- (4) Will the Attorney General table these briefing notes?

Hon MATTHEW SWINBOURN replied:

I thank the member for some notice of the question. The following information has been provided to me by the Attorney General.

- (1) As part of its duty to ensure that taxpayers' dollars are used effectively, the Department of Justice regularly reviews services provided by the Magistrates Court in Western Australia.
- (2) Approval to consult with stakeholders was given by the Attorney General on 28 March 2022, with consultation commencing in mid-April 2022.
- (3)–(4) More time is required to identify and review any relevant briefing notes. This will be done as soon as practicable and the member will be advised accordingly.
