

GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES, TEMPORARY AND CONTRACT POSITIONS

255. Hon C L Edwardes to the Minister for Education; Sport and Recreation; Indigenous Affairs

For each Department or Agency under the Minister's control –

- (a) how many temporary and contract positions are there; and
- (b) what is the annual salaries and wages budget exclusive of Workers Compensation and Superannuation for the temporary and contract positions?

Mr CARPENTER replied:

Department of Education

a) There were, as at 19 June 2001, 10 992 temporary and contract positions within the Education Department of Western Australia.

b) Annual salaries and wages budget exclusive of Workers Compensation and Superannuation for temporary and contract positions is \$256.4 million for the 2000-2001 financial year.

- (b) \$160,000

Department of Education Services

- (a) Temporary - 7 (NOTE: WAIS has interpreted this term to mean casual employees as they do not employ temporary staff.)  
Contract - Nil
- (b) Temporary (Casual) Salaries Budget - \$74,145  
Contract Salaries Budget - N/A

WA Sports Centre Trust

- a) There are no temporary positions and eight fixed term contract positions
- b) \$154,473.00

Sport & Recreation

- a) 120 staff are employed on a temporary or contract basis or engaged casually during a finite period.
- b) Sport and Recreation WA (including the Recreation camps and reserves Board Staff) does not have a separate budget allocation for temporary and contract positions. They are funded from the total salaries budget.
