Statement by Minister for Small Business

More than 250 representatives from the small business community attended a gala function at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre on Friday night, which was hosted by the Small Business Development Corporation. Collie business Agmaster added to its string of business awards by being named the 2005 Australia Post West Australian Regional Small Business of the Year for its innovative and revolutionary "no-till" seeding system for broadacre farming.
