## AUSTRALIAN SCIENCE ACADEMY, TOODYAY

## Hon BARRY HOUSE to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the minister's recent decision to reject the application for a proposed Australian science academy at Toodyay.

- (1) On what grounds did the minister reject this application?
- (2) If Toodyay is not suitable, where in Western Australia would the minister prefer this type of facility to be developed?

## Hon LJILJANNA RAVLICH replied:

(1)-(2) I do not recall that I personally rejected a proposal for a science academy in Toodyay.

Hon Barry House: Do you want me to show you a letter you signed?

Hon LJILJANNA RAVLICH: I sign hundreds of letters.

**Hon Norman Moore**: Are you saying that you don't read them?
