Statement by Member for Kingsley

MRS C.L. EDWARDES (Kingsley) [12.52 pm]: There is an opportunity to make the City of Perth the cultural hub of the State by a new museum becoming the centrepiece of the City of Perth's redevelopment. The City of Perth has recognised the planning opportunity presented by the need to move the museum from its current location. It wants to build a civic heart, including the Western Australian Museum, over the railway line when it is sunk in Northbridge. From a planning perspective, this certainly appears to be a wonderful way of connecting the business and commercial interests of the city with the entertainment precinct of Northbridge.

Every major city in the world holds its most treasured heritage collections close to the heart of the city.
