I refer to the staff employed by the Department of Environment and Conservation in the Peel region.

- (1) How many FTEs are allocated to this region?
- (2) Where are they based?
- (3) What is the job title for each of these FTEs?

Hon DONNA FARAGHER replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question.

- (1) The Department of Environment and Conservation has 67.2 staff employed in the Peel region at this time.
- (2) Eight are based in Mandurah, 19 in Jarrahdale and 40.2 in Dwellingup.
- (3) The job titles of each of these FTEs are, in Dwellingup: senior ranger, ranger, parks and visitor services officer, district coordinator—sustainable forest management, mining liaison officer, operations officer—sustainable forest management, assistant operations officer, fire operations officer, conservation employee, administration officer, clerical officer, overseer, operational works coordinator, special projects officer, research scientist, technical officer (research), manager organisational learning and development, coordinator—traineeships and cadetship programs, senior project officer, consultant learning programs, learning and development officer and registered training organisation compliance officer. In Jarrahdale: senior ranger, assistant operations officer, forester, fire operations officer, conservation employee, overseer, operational works coordinator. In Mandurah: senior planning officer, senior operations officer, nature conservation officer, senior ranger, ranger, clerical officer, conservation officer, and land for wildlife officer.
