CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY, NATIONAL CODE OF PRACTICE, NO TICKET, NO START SIGNS

- 556. Hon C L Edwardes to the Minister for Labour Relations
- (1) I refer the minister to the National Code of Practice for the Construction Industry, to which Western Australia is a signatory, and that the Employment Advocate has written to builders advising that the 'no-ticket-no-start' signs are in breach of the Code, and ask will the minister take action in having the signs removed?
- (2) If not, does the minister renege on the State's continuing participation under the National Code? Mr KOBELKE replied:
- (1) The Government fully supports the freedom of association provisions in the National Code of Practice. The provisions reflect those contained in the State Industrial Relations Act 1979.
 - The legal advice to the Government, in keeping with that also provided to the last Government, is that the displaying of No Ticket No Start signs is not in itself a breach of the Industrial Relations Act 1979. The Government does not intend to take action that cannot be supported by its legal advice.
- (2) The Government supports the principles contained in the National Code of Practice.
