1001. Mr Edwards to the Minister for the Environment and Heritage
- (1) Have the buildings comprising the Immigration Centre Precinct at the Fremantle Port been assessed for their heritage significance and, if so, how was that assessment funded?

 - (6) If the assessment referred to above was funded through a Government agency, will the Minister agree that the document, whether in draft or final form, should be accessible for public comment and scrutiny?
 - (7) If not, why not?
