## HOSPITALS, TEACHING AND RESEARCH, EXPENDITURE

- 1338. Mr Masters to the Minister for Health
- (1) Which public hospitals in Western Australia are involved in teaching?
- (2) Which public hospitals in Western Australia are involved in research?
- (3) For each hospital involved in teaching and / or research, what was their total expenditure for 1999 2000?
- (4) For each of these hospitals, what proportion of their 1999 2000 expenditure was allocated to teaching and related activities and / or what proportion was allocated to research and related activities?

## Mr KUCERA replied:

- (1)-(2) Hospitals receive funds for teaching and research from a number of areas including a general allocation from the Department of Health (DoH), specific research grants obtained by hospital staff and private donations. The DoH makes a combined allocation for teaching/research and these funds are provided through the budget allocation process to health services.
  - In 1999-00 the DoH provided funds for teaching/research to the Metropolitan Health Service Board (MHSB) for the teaching hospitals; Royal Perth Hospital, Sir Charles Gardiner Hospital, Fremantle Hospital, Princess Margaret Hospital and King Edward Memorial Hospital.
- (3)-(4) The general allocation for teaching/research from the DoH for teaching hospitals in 1999-00 was \$89.1M. Hospitals also receive additional monies from other sources (eg private donations and research grants) which may be directed to research and teaching.
