

CORRUPTION AND CRIME COMMISSION —
NORTH METROPOLITAN HEALTH SERVICE — MISCONDUCT

695. Hon TJORN SIBMA to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Health:

I refer to the period in which Mr John Fullerton and Mr David Mulligan were employed as executive directors by the North Metropolitan Health Service and were directly answerable to the chief executive officer of that service.

- (1) Did the outgoing CEO of the North Metropolitan Health Service, Mr Wayne Salvage, provide a handover brief to his successor, Dr Russell-Weisz, and did that information reflect on allegations of corrupt conduct levelled at Mr Fullerton or Mr Mulligan?
- (2) On how many occasions were Mr Fullerton and/or Mr Mulligan subject to periodic performance reviews by either Dr Russell-Weisz or his predecessor Mr Salvage?
- (3) If such standard performance evaluations were conducted, will the minister seek to make those reports public?
- (4) If these standard performance evaluations were not conducted, has the minister sought an explanation; and what reasons have been provided?

Hon ALANNA CLOHESY replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question. I am advised of the following.

- (1) Mr Salvage provided his successor, Ms Angela Kelly, with a verbal handover on the investigation by the Corruption and Crime Commission.
- (2)–(4) The information required to answer the honourable member's questions requires a review of archived records. The North Metropolitan Health Service is unable to respond within the allocated time frame and as such I request the honourable member to place these questions on notice.
