Question: Mrs Edwardes asked whether the minister could provide further information on the parity and wages policy, and the priority and assurance dividend.

Answer: To bring about wages parity within the public sector the government has established a benchmark rate of pay. Agencies with pay rates below this benchmark are to receive funding for pay increases with the aim of lifting the rates to the benchmark. Agencies with pay rates above the benchmark will be subject to a wage freeze when their current Workplace Agreement expires.

The following adjustments were proposed as part of the Water and Rivers Commission's contribution to the Government's Priority and Assurance Dividend. The adjustments have been made with a minimal impact of service levels and after considering whole of state priorities for water resources management.
