A Bill for

An Act to facilitate the preservation of the State's published documentary heritage for current and future generations by —

- requiring the deposit with the State Librarian of copies of certain published material; and
- authorising the State Librarian to require that certain material published on the Internet be deposited with the State Librarian, and to make consequential amendments to the *Library Board of Western Australia Act 1951* and for related purposes.

16. Who may commence criminal proceedings 22

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Without limiting the functions of the DPP under the Director of 23 Public Prosecutions Act 1991, a prosecution for an offence 24 under this Act may only be commenced by the Board or a 25 person authorised in writing by the Board to do so. 26
