1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Death of Malcolm John Bryce - a former Member of the Legislative Assembly

The Premier, without notice, moved,

11. Matter of Public Interest – McGowan Government First Year

The Speaker informed the Assembly that he was in receipt of a notice from Dr M.D. Nahan that he intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

At least five members having risen in support,

Dr M.D. Nahan moved,

That this House condemns the McGowan Government for its failures in its first year of Government, including broken promises on taxation, jobs and financial management.

Debate ensued.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Premier speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.

Suspension of Standing Orders

The Leader of the House, without notice, moved,

That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as is necessary to enable any time remaining and the vote on the Matter of Public Interest to be taken forthwith.

The Speaker having counted the House, and an absolute majority being present and there being no dissentient voice, declared the motion to be carried with the concurrence of an absolute majority of the whole number of members of the House.

13. Education and Health Standing Committee Referral

Mr R.S. Love, pursuant to notice, moved,

That this House directs the Education and Health Standing Committee to inquire into the Labor Government's cuts to education, announced 13 December 2017, to determine:

- (1) The educational impacts of the closure of Moora Residential College, closure or privatisation of six camp schools, cuts to the WA Agricultural Colleges Trust Fund, and increased fees for Vacsxim; and
- (2) The appropriateness of the decision-making process behind the cuts, including any consultation that was undertaken.
