Question No. A2: Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich MLC asked –

Please provide the whole number (not percentage) breakdown by regional and metropolitan areas, based on the total number of students published in the 2010-11 Annual Report, of the number of students in the At Risk – Indicated, At Risk – Moderate and At Risk – Severe categories of attendance that year.

Answer: Hansard from 2012/13 Budget Estimates Hearing of Tuesday, 5 June 2012 (pages 14 to 18) presents data that was an approximation. The following provides further explanation.

The total number of students used in the calculation during the Hearing was based on a census figure for all students K-12 (i.e. non-compulsory and compulsory years). Reported attendance data:

- relates only to students in Years 1-12 (and does not include students in non-compulsory Kindergarten and Pre Primary);
- do not include students in schools such as Canning and Tuart Colleges, SIDE, Schools of the Air and Hospital School Services; and
- excludes students on the Participation List.

The 'At Risk – Severe' category refers to students with less than 60% attendance, not 50% as stated in the hearing. The percentage of students whose attendance falls within the 'At Risk – Severe' category is 3.41% (not 4.27%). The initial calculation of 4.27% incorrectly included students across the State for whom the Western Australian Institute for Deaf Education (WAIDE) provides services. These students were identified as 0% attendance when, in reality, their attendance is recorded in their home school.

Student attendance is broadly grouped into the following categories:

'Regular attendance' = 90%+ attendance

'Non-regular attendance' as follows:

At Risk – Indicated = 80 – 89% attendance
 At Risk – Moderate = 60 – 79% attendance

• At Risk – Severe = <60% attendance

Question No. A3: Hon Giz Watson MLC asked -

What proportion of children who do not engage with the education system suffer from hearing damage, and what impact has that had?

Answer: It is unknown what proportion of students not engaged with the education system suffers from hearing difficulties. Unless a student is engaged with the system, details such as whether or not the child has some form of hearing difficulty is often not known.

There is no question that hearing difficulties can contribute to student disengagement with learning. If and when a school becomes aware of an issue with any student's hearing, it is investigated. Schools will refer children with suspected ear disease to the school nurse or a general practitioner. If required, the Department of Education's WA Institute for Deaf Education will support these children through access to an educational audiologist and/or the visiting teacher of the deaf service.

The sound field *Amplification for Kimberley Classrooms Project* provides an example of how this issue is being addressed. The project supplied sound field systems to all classrooms in the Kimberley region (22 public schools, 14 Catholic schools, 6 Independent schools). All staff received training and support to implement the use of the systems. This included training on aural and personal hygiene and nutrition, recognising these are also factors that affect a child's ear health and hearing. The project reported that there were noticeable improvements in student engagement, that classroom environments were calmer, and teachers reported less voice stress.

Question No. A4: Hon Philip Gardiner MLC asked -

Do you have any great success stories where you have got a high attendance in a school which is not dissimilar to Roebourne's socioeconomic demographics?

Answer: Schools with a similar Socio-Economic Index (SEI) to Roebourne tend to be remote or very remote schools with a very high proportion of Indigenous students and a relatively small student population. Many of these schools have a high level of mobility among their student population.

Despite these factors, many schools achieve attendance rates well above those of Roebourne District High School.

Attachment 1 shows schools with a similar SEI to Roebourne District High School that had an average attendance rate of at least 75% in 2011 and at least 30 students with attendance data in 2011. The 2011 attendance data is for Semester One only, as this is the only point when attendance data is collected centrally. The attendance data is for Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students combined.

Schools highlighted dark grey averaged above 80% and those highlighted light grey averaged above 75%.

Answer: Much of this success can be attributed to the work of individual public schools who work tirelessly at the local level to ensure that their unique cohorts of students are afforded the best possible pathways.

The Department's approach focused on supporting schools, school leaders and teachers to:

- design and implement pathways that lead to more students making a successful transition from school to higher education, further training or employment;
- set and achieve targets relating to university entrance results and completion of VET qualifications;
- ensure students with special educational needs and disability make successful transitions through school to further education, employment or alternatives to employment;
- plan, develop and implement whole-school literacy and numeracy improvement processes;
- provide students with access to vocational programs and workplace learning; and
- assist students at risk of not completing school through tailored engagement programs that provide a pathway to WACE and/or AQF qualifications.

I would like to reiterate that this very pleasing outcome is a result of the sustained efforts of schools to ensure the very best future opportunities for all of their students.

It was explained to the Committee that:

• the document was approximately 18 months old when tabled.

The overriding direction from Government is that the Department must operate within its approved budget without affecting frontline services. The Department has achieved this, delivering a surplus in 2009/10 and 2010/11.
