Answer: The Department of Education has a minimum requirement of a four-year tertiary teaching qualification and recognises a range of specialisations. A four-year teaching qualification can be either a four-year Bachelor of Education or a three-year degree in a relevant discipline plus a one-year graduate diploma with a specialisation. The Department does not specify that teachers in middle years settings hold a specific qualification with a middle years specialisation.

The Bachelor of Education with middle school specialisation is a recognised qualification that some teachers in a district high school may hold. Other teachers in district high schools may hold teaching qualifications with other specialisations.

(5) If no to 4, at which schools and in which subjects are students being taught by teachers whose training does not include these tertiary qualifications?
