CHAPTER 2	FINANCIAL STATEMENT	

COMMITTEE'S FUNCTIONS AND POWERS

The functions of the Committee are to review and report to the Assembly on: -

- (a) the outcomes and administration of the departments within the committee's portfolio responsibilities;
- (b) annual reports of government departments laid on the Table of the House;
- (c) the adequacy of legislation and regulations within its jurisdiction; and
- (d) any matters referred to it by the Assembly including a bill, motion, petition, vote or expenditure, other financial matter, report or paper.

At the commencement of each Parliament and as often thereafter as the Speaker considers necessary, the Speaker will determine and table a schedule showing the portfolio responsibilities for each committee. Annual reports of government departments and authorities tabled in the Assembly will stand referred to the relevant committee for any inquiry the committee may make.

Whenever a committee receives or determines for itself fresh or amended terms of reference, the committee will forward them to each standing and select committee of the Assembly and joint committee of the Assembly and Council. The Speaker will announce them to the Assembly at the next opportunity and arrange for them to be placed on the notice boards of the Assembly.

CHAIR'S FOREWORD

I have great pleasure in tabling the Community Development and Justice Standing Committee's fifth report, the Annual Report for 2003-2004.

During the course of this reporting period (1 July 2003 - 30 June 2004) the Committee has embarked on its second major inquiry, Arts in Regional Western Australia. By the time the Committee report to the Legislative Assembly in the second half of 2004, it will have visited all regions within Western Australia, as well as regional New South Wales and Victoria; it will have received dozens of detailed submissions from people throughout Western Australia; and it will have spoken with people involved in the Arts from Derby to Albany.

I believe that the Committee's work will assist in highlighting the importance of the arts within regional Western Australia. It is the Committee's view that the arts makes an important contribution to the economic, social and cultural diversity and well being of regional communities.

1.1 Introduction

During the course of this reporting period (Table 1.1), the Committee:

- Conducted 1 inquiry involving 21 meetings, including 12 deliberative meetings;
- Took evidence and was briefed by 126 people, in Perth and regional Western Australia:
- Undertook investigative travel to Karratha; Derby; Broome; Geraldton;
 Kalgoorlie; Esperance; Denmark; Albany; and Kellerberrin.

1.4 Investigative Travel

During 2003/04, the Committee undertook investigative travel in Western Australia visiting the regions of the Gascoyne; Goldfields-Esperance; Great Southern; Kimberley; Mid West; Peel; Pilbara; South West and Wheatbelt. The people the Committee spoke to are listed above in Tables 1.2 and 1.3.

1.5 Reports Tabled

The Committee tabled the Annual Report 2002-03 during the period 1 July 2003 - 30 June 2004, and was still conducting an inquiry as at 30 June. See 1.6 Works in Progress.

1.6 Work in Progress

(a) Inquiry into the Arts in Regional Western Australia

That the Committee examine, report and make recommendations on the economic, cultural and social impact of the Arts in regional Western Australia. The Committee will pay particular attention to:

- the benefits of the Arts to regional Western Australia;
- the level of local content in the Arts;

- the level of employment generated by the Arts;
- the impact and effectiveness of government funding of the Arts; and
- the impact and effectiveness of arts festivals to the state and regions.

Due to extended travel into regional Western Australia extending the previous deadline it is the Committee's intention to report its findings to the Legislative Assembly on or before October 2004.

The Committee held informal meetings and formal public hearings in Karratha, Derby, Broome, Geraldton, Kalgoorlie, Esperance, Bunbury, Albany and Kellerberrin. Formal hearings were also held in Perth in 2004. Again, all of the people the Committee spoke with on these investigative trips are listed in Tables 1.2 and 1.3.

(b) Rehabilitation in Prisons Inquiry

Intended to follow the inquiry into Arts in regional Western Australia, the Committee adopted terms of reference for an inquiry into Rehabilitation in Prisons. The terms of reference read:

That the Committee examine, report and make recommendations on the effectiveness of rehabilitation programs in prisons in Western Australia, with particular reference to:

- the current recidivism rates in Western Australia, by prison and by offence and comparative recidivism rates in similar jurisdictions;
- the management structures responsible for rehabilitation programs;
- the resourcing of rehabilitation programs, including facilities and staffing;
- the role that prison officers play in rehabilitation, including selection processes and provision of training; and
- the review processes for rehabilitation programs, and specifically the methods by which programs are evaluated and how the results are reported.

Due to the extension of the Arts in Regional Western Australia inquiry deadline the Committee will be unable to complete this inquiry in the life of this Parliament.

CHAPTER 2 FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Community Development and Justice Standing Committee does not have its own formal budget and is funded out of the budget of the Legislative Assembly. Approval for major expenditures is required on a case-by-case basis and is entirely at the discretion of the Speaker.
