Environmental and Social risks

Health risks

September is US National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. Congressman Brian Higgins addressed the House yesterday saying "Cancer is the leading cause of death in children over 1 year old. Moreover, cancer kills more children than cystic fibrosis, muscular dystrophy, aids, asthma, and diabetes combined. ... Our children deserve to be cancer-free, they deserve to be just kids."
